Session Objectives

The Primary Care Provider and the Psychiatrist in the Emerging Medical Home Model

2. Identify anti-seizure drugs such as Depakote that now have FDA-approval for psychiatric use.
3. Describe differences in how neurologists and psychiatrists use anti-seizure drugs.
4. Recognize potential drug interactions between standard psychotropic agents and anti-seizure drugs used in psychiatry.

2. Describe the role of anticonvulsants in Psychiatry.
3. Recognize the side effect profile of the anticonvulsant medications.
